These students were on two of the 14 best teams of 1,118 teams, in the 2024 X-Culture Project during the fall semester. They received Best Team certificates and are invited to the upcoming X-Culture Symposium, which will be held in Finland this summer. X-Culture is a large-scale international experiential learning project with around 6000 students from 135 universities in more than 50 countries participating every semester. In the project, students are placed on international teams that contain students from different countries. Students work on a real company challenge and develop a consulting report via online collaboration. X-Culture is a global project that immerses students and professionals in real-world cross-cultural collaboration. This hands-on business experience strengthens resumes, making participants more competitive in the worldwide job market.
